3. Students may leave campus at the conclusion of exams with a completed permission form signed by their parent(s). Once students leave campus for the day, they may not return.
4. Students remaining on campus after exams are to report to lunch and the designated class or area for the day.
5. All students should report to school on January 14 – 18 for periods 1 – 4 exams.
6. Make-up exams will be administered by appointment with the teacher.
7. Students must be present at the beginning of each exam period to take the exam. ***Students must be present for the entire exam period to receive credit for the exam.***
8. Students who are on campus during an exam period for which they do not have an exam or scheduled review session must report to ALC in Room 203.
9. The campuses of Leesville Road Elementary School and Leesville Road Middle School, as well as other Wake County schools, are strictly off limits on these dates to Leesville Road High School students.
10. **For all courses, the final exam is worth 20% of the student's final grade. This includes End-of-Course (EOC) Exams, North Carolina Final Exams (NCFE), or Teacher-Made Exams.**
