



LRHS Scholarship Bulletin

February 2019

This bulletin is not meant to be an all-inclusive list of scholarship information. It only contains information on scholarships that we have actually received at the school. It often does not contain college/university specific scholarships, unless it is a college/university scholarship that requires a specific nomination from Leesville. Students are encouraged to look at the websites for the colleges to which they are applying for specific scholarship information.

1. **State Employees' Credit Union "People Helping People" Scholarship** - This \$10,000 scholarship is open to any senior who meets the following criteria:
 - Is either an SECU member or is eligible for membership through a parent/guardian
 - A minimum 2.5 GPA
 - Identifies a financial need as determined by submission of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 - Documented acceptance at one of the 16 public universities in North Carolina
 - Legal Residency in North Carolina and U.S Citizenship
 - An agreement to attend the same public university for eight consecutive semesters
 - **OUTSTANDING EVIDENCE** of leadership, character, integrity, and community involvement
 - Is not an employee or family member of an employee of the State Employees' Credit Union

Leesville's scholarship committee can select a primary nominee and a secondary nominee for this scholarship whose information will be sent to a committee at Central Office for the final selection process. A total of 35 scholarships will be awarded across the high schools in Wake County.

- **Interested seniors should pick up an application packet and instructions in the Student Service's Office. Requested information should be returned to Student Services by February 20.**

2. **WCPSS Future Teachers Program** -The Future Teachers Program is a recruitment initiative aimed at developing the district's internal student talent. Future Teachers participants are WCPSS high school graduates who intend to pursue careers in education and who commit to teaching with us upon completion of their teacher preparation programs. Future Teachers is not a scholarship. WCPSS graduating high school seniors who have (or will) gain admittance to a college or university for the Fall 2019 semester, and who intend to pursue K-12 teaching careers with WCPSS in one of the following licensure areas: • Birth-Kindergarten • Career and Technical Education • Elementary Education • English/Language Arts • English Second Language • Math • Science • Social Studies • Special Education • World Languages. Additional Information and Instructions can be found in the Student Services Office. The deadline to apply is April 5.
3. **Assistance League of the Triangle Scholarship**- This scholarship is open to any senior planning to attend college. Applications can be found here: <http://altriangle.org/philanthropic-programs/scholarship/>. The deadline to apply is March 1.
4. **GSK Opportunity Scholarship** is available to US citizens who are residents of Durham, Orange, or Wake County and have overcome significant adversity. Scholarships are valued at \$5,000 per year, renewable for up to four years, for a total award up to \$20,000. Recipients must attend a public state university or

community college in North Carolina. Applications can be found at: <http://trianglecf.org/award/gsk-opportunity-scholarship/> Applications due March 15, 2019.

5. **Benjamin F. Ward Scholarship** honors Mr. Ward's extraordinary commitment to teaching and community service by providing financial assistance to graduating high school seniors in Durham, Orange, Wake, or Chatham counties intending to attend a North Carolina college or university full-time. Recipients will be selected based on financial need and commitment to community service and involvement. Scholarships are valued at \$2,500 per academic year for up to four years for a total award of \$10,000. 6. **Light on the Hill Scholarship** will award 10 scholarships to African-American students who will enroll at UNC for fall 2019. Awards will be based on Academic Achievement, Evidence of community services, Leadership Qualities, and Strength of Essays. To apply visit: alumni.unc.edu/loth. The deadline to apply is March 3.
7. **2019 African-American Network Carolinas Scholarship Fund**- This \$2000 scholarship is for any graduation African-American senior planning to attend college in either North or South Carolina with a plan to major in engineering, math, science, computer science, accounting, finance or business administration. Applications can be found at <https://fftc-scholarships.communityforce.com> The deadline to apply is March 1.
8. **The Woman's Club of Raleigh** is offering two scholarships to graduating seniors. The scholarships are valued at \$1000. Applicants must plan on attending college or university in North Carolina. Applications can be found at: <https://womansclubofraleigh.org/community-service/scholarships/> The deadline to apply is March 9.

UPDATED GPA AND RANK

- ✓ Updated GPA and Rank will be ready on February 11.

MIDYEAR TRANSCRIPTS

- ✓ First, most colleges do not require or ask for an updated transcript, However...
- ✓ **If the college or university is asking for a midyear transcript or updated grades and uses the Common Application Program. You must email your assigned counselor to let them know.**
- ✓ If you need a midyear transcript sent to a college or university **in North Carolina**, you may request this through your CFNC account. However, do NOT make the request until February 11 if you want your class rank to be correct.
- ✓ If the college or university needs an updated transcript and is outside of North Carolina, continue to use the SCRIBORDER Website: <https://wcpss.scriborder.com/>
- ✓ Many colleges and universities ask that you self-report your 1st semester grades. If this is the case, then you would not need to request a transcript.

SCHOLARSHIP RECOGNITION

- ✓ You can be recognized at Senior Assembly for any scholarships that you have been offered, even if you do not accept them. However, we must have proof that you were offered the scholarship, so keep track of any scholarship letters you receive. We will notify you later in the semester as to how to submit this information to the Student Services Office.

GRADES FROM DUAL ENROLLMENT

- ✓ If you took a class 1st semester outside of LRHS, NC State or Wake Tech CCP for example, you must request an official transcript be sent to Mr. Greene if you want the credit to show up on your high school transcript.

FINANCIAL AID COUNSELOR AT LEESVILLE

- ✓ Ms. Norwood is our Financial Aid Counselor. She is here every Thursday to assist parents and students with the Federal Financial Aid Process and can assist with the completion of the FAFSA form.
