AP Testing-Additional Information

- High school students who participate in Advanced Placement (AP) courses are eligible to participate in AP exams in the spring semester.
- The primary method of administering AP exams this spring will be through a digital format. A paper/pencil version of the exam will be available where a need exists.
- Students who need to participate via a paper/pencil exam should contact Mr. Cummings **no later Wednesday, March 24**.
- Students will be provided an excused absence from all classes on the day of their exam.
- Students who participate in the digital exam will take their exam independently from their home and/or another location of their choosing. If a student is unable to identify an appropriated location that is conducive to their success on the exam, they can alert the AP Coordinator at the school who will work





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with them to participate in the test at school. The deadline to request this is Friday, April 30.

HOW 2021 DIGITAL AP EXAMS ARE DIFFERENT THAN 2020 EMERGENCY AP EXAMS

	2021 Digital AP Exams	2020 Emergency AP Exams
Length	Full-length (around 3 hrs)	Shortened (around 45 mins)
Question Types	Most 2021 digital AP Exams include multiple- choice and free-response questions	Only included free-response questions
Handwritten Responses	All answers to free-response questions must be typed into the digital testing application	Students had the option to submit photos of handwritten responses
Devices	Computers only (PC, Mac, school-managed Chromebook)	Computers, smart phones, and tablets were permitted
Internet	Requires internet, but designed to enable students to continue testing, even if there's a momentary disruption in local connectivity	Required internet
World Language and Music Theory Exams	Not offered in digital format because of student access to online translation apps and instruments, which don't allow for secure and fair assessment of reading and writing skills and sight-singing	Only the speaking skill was assessed on world language exams
