Graduation Requirements

- 4 English Courses
 - English I, II, III, IV
- 4 Math Courses
 - Math I, II, III, IV or Pre-Calculus Honors
- 3 Science Course
 - Earth/Environmental Science, Biology, a Physical Science (Physical Science, Chemistry or AP Physics I)
- 4 Social Studies Courses
 - World History,
 - American History I and American History II, or American History II and a SS elective, or American History I and a SS elective or AP US History and A Social Studies Elective,
 - Civics & Economics
- 1 Healthful Living Course
- 10 Elective Courses
 - To include 2 years of a World Language if planning to attend a 4-year university

•Total Minimum Credits Required to Graduate= 26




Attend 2-Year College

•NC Community College System:

- One of the largest systems of higher education in the nation with <u>58</u> comprehensive community colleges serving all 100 NC counties.
- One within a 30-minute drive of all NC residents.
- Lowest tuition in the Southeast Region one of the lowest in the nation!
- You may apply to the community college of your choice, regardless of your county of residence.
- You may complete the <u>first 2 years</u> of a 4-year degree through the College Transfer Program <u>OR</u> enroll in a 2-year Associate's Degree program.
- Gives you time to improve on academic skills and complete college minimum admissions requirements or focus on a specialized area of study.


When will I apply to colleges/universities?

Most **applications** will open on August 1 for students **applying** for Fall **2023** enrollment.

College deadlines most often fall between November and February. Students may choose to apply for Early Admissions, Early Decision or Regular Decision.

Applying to College





- Create your account and get started
- O Be sure to enter in my name and email address as your 'counselor' so that I can upload your transcript and complete your recommendation



- Click on "Apply to College" and start the process
- You can apply to any North Carolina colleges via CFNC

Why do colleges and universities ask you to write essays?


- Because there is more to you than your test scores and grades.
- Essays provide you the opportunity to describe who you are as a person and what your passions are.
- Always write the 'optional' essay!
- Essays should be between 250 to 650 words
- Many colleges may also ask you to complete supplemental essay questions that are tailored to their schools.
- A small number of colleges do not require essays but may require shorter writing supplements.



2023-24 Common App Essay Prompts

- Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Reflect on something that someone has done for you that has made you happy or thankful in a surprising way. How has this gratitude affected or motivated you?





Prompts Continued

5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.

6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?

7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

We will also retain the <u>optional COVID-19</u> question within the Additional Information section.

College Admissions Offices Consider

- **Course Selection**
 - Take the most challenging courses you can take and earn A's and B's in
- GPA/Class Rank
 - Your GPA at the end of your junior year is the GPA they will use on their college applications
 Your class rank will be re-calculated in
- Sept/Oct of their senior year and rank will be used reported on college applications
- SAT/ACT Scores (Test Optional- TBD)
- Essays
- Extracurricular Activities
- Recommendations (some schools)

Choosing the Right College

Do your research!

- O What are the admissions requirements?
- Consider majors/curriculum, location, cost/financial, student life, programs of study, size, public vs private, housing, extracurriculars, study abroad programs, campus life, campus security, etc.
- Become familiar with colleges' websites
- Use research resources like College Board Big Future

Choosing the Right College

Go On College Visits!

- Virtual campus tours are available for many campuses
- Check school's absence policy for college visits
- "Demonstrated interest" is often marked in you application fil

Ask for Help!

- Ask family, friends, teachers, or others about their college experiences
- Contact the admissions counselor at the college(s) you are applying to for school-specific questions



College Admissions Options



EARLY ACTION: is an admissions procedure to notify students of early admissions to the college. Students do not need to accept the college's offer of admissions but may file other applications (used by UNC, NCSU, Georgetown, Yale, etc.). The process is highly selective therefore, some points to remember are that early action candidates must have superior records candidates can be rejected, and financial awards are made in April.

EARLY DECISION: is a plan under which you may submit your credentials early to one college, usually by October 15 of your senior year. You are notified of your status by late December early January. As part of an early decision plan, you are required to sign a statement agreeing to accept the college's offer of admission. You must also withdraw your application from other colleges if accepted under Early Decision. (Used by Duke, Elon, Wake Forest, etc.) Points to remember are the same as listed above in Early Action.

REGULAR ADMISSION: candidates apply from November to February, depending on the individual applicant and specific college deadline(s). Check the deadline for each individual school.

ROLLING ADMI SSION: candidates apply at their convenience up to a certain date. They typically receive an offer of acceptance or rejection within four to six weeks. (Used often by Community Colleges and some four-year institutions)

•All Seniors are required to pay a Senior Graduation Fee to help offset costs associated with Graduation. These fees will be applied to the Diploma, Diploma Cover, Graduation Program, Senior Reception recognition certificates, and the Senior Celebration. The fee will be \$40.00 for the 2023-2024 school year.

Information on how to submit payment will be available through the WCPSS Online Payment link in early July. The school will notify families when the link to submit payment becomes available so, please check your email regularly during the summer as to not miss important information.



Current Juniors: As of 2020, state law mandates that ALL rising seniors have a Meningitis vaccination before beginning their senior year.


