



WORLD LANGUAGES

- World language credits are NOT REQUIRED for graduation. However, they are needed for entry to a 4-year UNC system college/university.
 - Need TWO levels of ONE language
 - Spanish 1&2, Latin 1&2, French 1&2
- If you are currently in Spanish 1 (8th grade), continue with language next year.
- Why wait?
 - Give students time to get used to the block schedule
 - Moves FAST and is as difficult as a core class
 - Students have more space for electives so they could take both levels in one year (no gap!)
 - Can still make it to the AP level if they begin sophomore year
- NCVPS Languages (Arabic, Japanese, etc.): NOT available to PCHS students


IEP: Will transfer to new school and a case manager will be assigned

- ➤ Be your child's advocate
- ► Ask questions & seek help



REGISTRATION PROCESS (HOW DOES THIS WORK?)

- 1. Review your information received by the middle school with your child.
- 2. View teacher recommendations.
- 3. Select classes with your child.
- 4. Student registers on PowerSchool and Major Clarity with the counselor at their Middle School
- 5. PCHS Counselors will not be able to meet with you about registration. It all goes through your middle school.
- 6. Attend Freshman Orientation in August.
