

WCPSS uses the Latin Academic Honors System. This recognition is based off of the cumulative weighted GPA at the end of the first semester of your senior year. There are three distinct categories for eligibility Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, and Summa Cum Laude.

<u>Cum Laude:</u> graduating with "honor" by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from 3.75 - 3.99 <u>Magna Cum Laude:</u> graduating with "great honor" by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from 4.0 - 4.249 <u>Summa Cum Laude:</u> graduating with "highest honor" by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from 4.25 ≤

A student's grade point average (GPA) is calculated by adding all quality points earned while in high school (grades 9-12) and dividing by the number of courses taken. The weighted GPA includes any additional quality points earned by taking Honors/AP/IB courses, while the unweighted GPA does not include any additional quality points.

### **AP Courses & Dual Enrollment**

When contemplating the decision of taking AP classes, students and parents should be aware that these courses are rigorous and include intense reading and writing assignments. AP exams are scheduled in May. Taking and passing the exam(s) could result in earning college credits.

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
#### **AP Courses & Dual Enrollment**


