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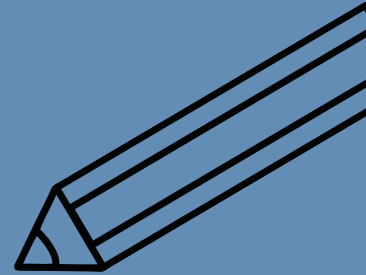
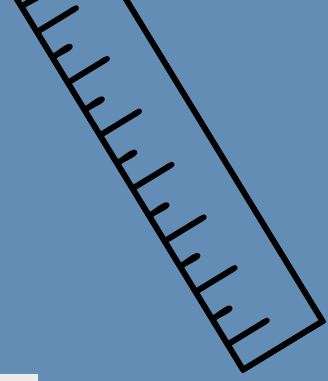

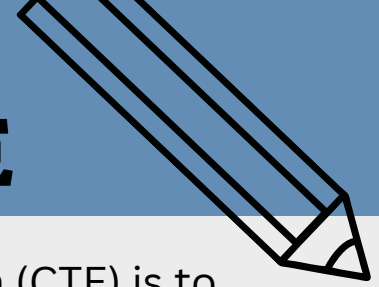

Career Services & CTE



The mission of Career and Technical Education (CTE) is to empower all students to be successful citizens, workers and leaders in a global economy. CTE gives purpose to learning by emphasizing real-world skills and practical knowledge. Programs in Career and Technical Education are designed to contribute to the broad educational achievement of students, including basic skills such as reading, writing, and mathematics, as well as their ability to work independently and as part of a team, think creatively, solve problems, and utilize technology. These tools and experiences make school more relevant, and ensure students are ready for the real world. Whether students plan to further their education in community colleges, technical schools, four-year colleges and universities, receive on-the-job training, or pursue careers in the military, CTE can be the first step in a pathway toward productive employment and citizenship.

In the state of North Carolina, we are proud to have 931,801 Career and Technical Education participants. The 2018 CTE Concentrator Graduation rate of 99.2% is evidence of how CTE is learning that works for North Carolina.

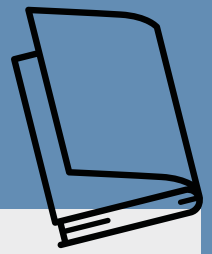

9th Grade	English I; two credits in the areas of mathematics, social studies, or science; and three additional credits	6
10th Grade	English II; one credit in mathematics; one credit in social studies; one credit in science; and two additional credits	12
11th Grade	English III; enrollment in a program which, if successfully accomplished, will result in the completion of graduation requirements	18

A 10-point grading scale is used to calculate grades. Students will receive numeric grades on their transcript.

Promotions & Grading Policy



GPA is calculated as unweighted and weighted. A weighted GPA provides an additional 0.5 quality point for Honors and an additional 1.0 quality point for AP.

WCPSS uses the Latin Academic Honors System. This recognition is based off of the cumulative weighted GPA at the end of the first semester of your senior year. There are three distinct categories for eligibility Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, and Summa Cum Laude.

Cum Laude: graduating with “honor” by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from 3.75 - 3.99

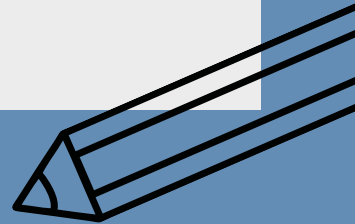
Magna Cum Laude: graduating with “great honor” by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from 4.0 - 4.249


Summa Cum Laude: graduating with “highest honor” by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from $4.25 \leq$

A student's grade point average (GPA) is calculated by adding all quality points earned while in high school (grades 9-12) and dividing by the number of courses taken. The weighted GPA includes any additional quality points earned by taking Honors/AP/IB courses, while the unweighted GPA does not include any additional quality points.

AP Courses & Dual Enrollment

When contemplating the decision of taking AP classes, students and parents should be aware that these courses are rigorous and include intense reading and writing assignments. AP exams are scheduled in May. Taking and passing the exam(s) could result in earning college credits.

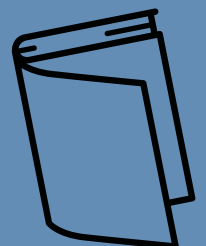

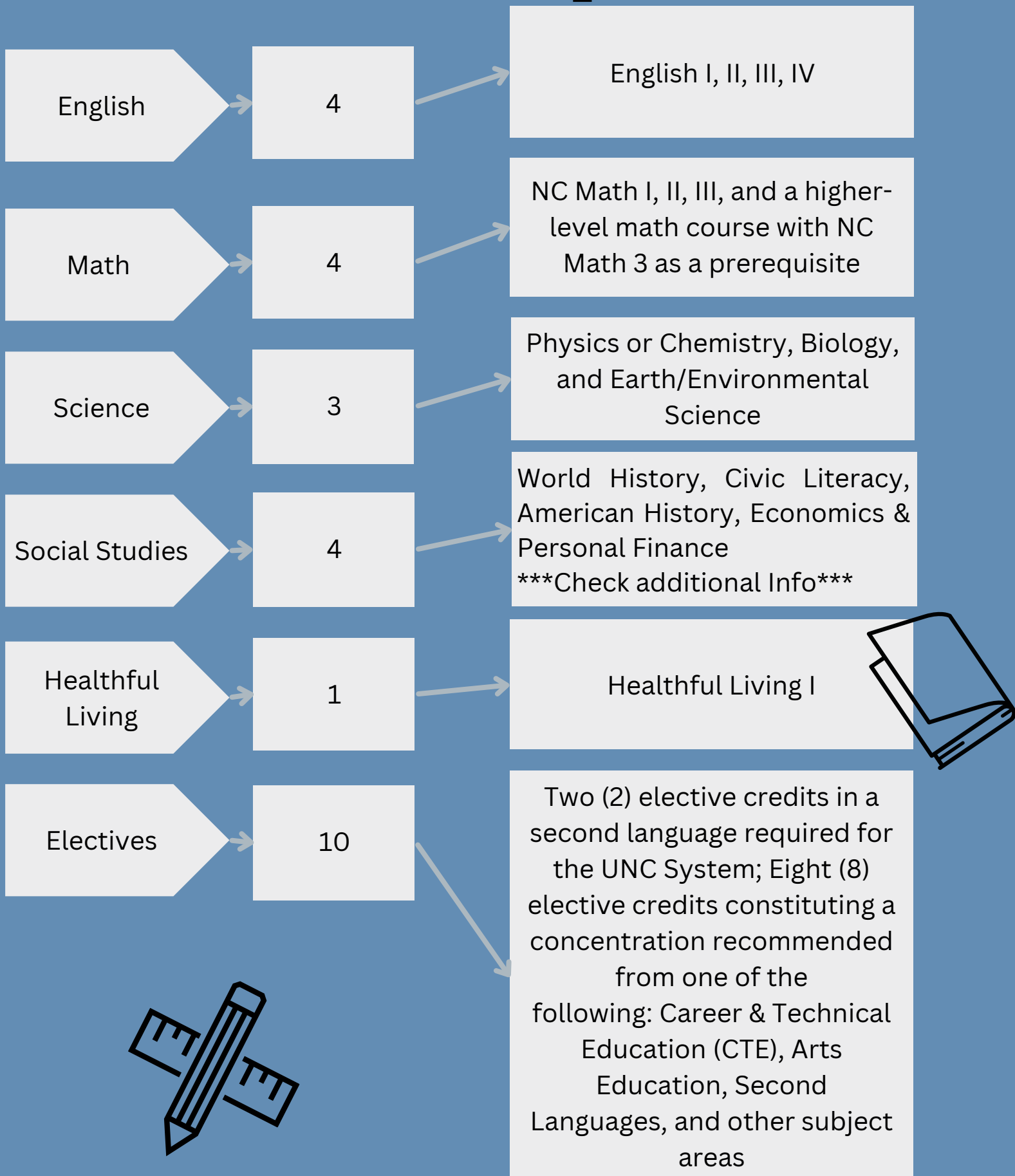

World History, American History I & II, and American History: Founding Principles, Civics, & Economics



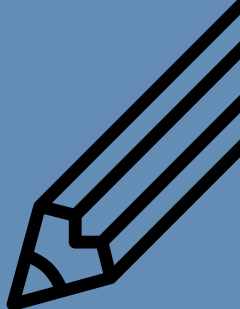
