# WHAT'S NEW AT DOUGLAS THIS YEAR?

There are lots of exciting innovations at Douglas to check out during your next visit:

- In the hallways, we have installed **Lego Walls** for the students to show their mastery of the standards through their creative and visual expressions.
- We have designated spaces for different disciplines: the **Creativity Cave** supports the arts, the **Think Tank** is an additional space for science experiments and investigations and the **Collaboration Station** is for multiple classes to work together in a creative space. Our teachers will meet in the **Innovators' Inn**, which is a unique and forward-thinking space to foster their creativity, critical thinking and collaboration.
- The Music Garden will include a combination of artist/student-created instruments and a combination of chimes, drums, bells and a xylophone created by a company called Free Notes. This project was funded by the the PTA and the 4C's grant from Wake County. This awesome music garden will live in the area just outside the modulars by the basketball court. The instruments made by artist/students will be made using recycled materials and mounted on our 'music wall'. We expect this area to be complete by winter break.
- Art Boards in the Kindergarten Area were purchased last year and installed this summer by the PTA for the kindergarten play area. <u>These boards can be</u> <u>used year-round for many fun projects!</u>
- The PTA funded the purchase of hundreds of large and medium sized Imagination Blocks to be used for creative play with all grades. Enough were purchased and are stored in rolling bins so that many classes may have access to these blocks at any given time. These will be used in classrooms, collaborative spaces, outdoors and even during indoor recess! <u>Learn more</u> <u>about imagination blocks</u>.
