There are 15 books on the Battle of the Books lists this year. Team Captains will be chosen from students that have **read all the books, pass a test and exhibit leadership** during team meetings.

Students are encouraged to read all the books. We have multiple copies of all books in the library. Students should try not to check out more than 2 at a time to allow everyone access to the books.

Students need to read at least 14 of these books to stay on the team and have basic knowledge of the other books. Students will be quizzed on the books and authors to see if they have read them. Last year, we had 4 teams competing. In order to be placed on a team, students need to demonstrate that they have read the books. We will be competing in front of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade classes and parents.
