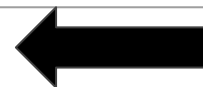

How to Pick Elective Classes

Considerations

- Interests
- Prerequisites to other classes
 - E.g., you want to take early childhood development so you take parenting and child development

Languages

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- Need TWO levels of ONE language to go to a 4 year college
 - Spanish 1&2, Latin 1&2, French 1&2
- If you are currently in Spanish (8th grade), continue with language next year.
- If not, I recommend starting sophomore or junior year
 - Give students time to get used to the block schedule
 - Moves FAST and is as difficult as a core class
 - Students have more space for electives so they could take both levels in one year (no gap!)
 - Can still make it to the AP level
- Native Speakers: Heritage One or Spanish 2 (sometimes speak it at home) or Spanish 3 (always speak spanish at home)

IEP/504/AIG

How do these transfer?

IEP: Will transfer to new school and a case manager will be assigned

504: Will transfer to new school and school counselor will be case manager


