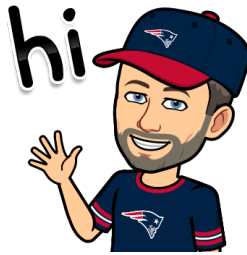


Mr. Danahy's Welcome Letter
