Oberlin Family Updates Wednesday, October 21, 2020

- 1. Click this link to see the <u>bell schedule</u> that we will begin using on Monday, November 9 when our Plan B students return to the building. This schedule will allow teachers to accommodate Virtual Academy, Face-to-Face, and Remote students simultaneously. We recognize this schedule is a change for all students. However, we feel this will allow us to best meet the needs of all our students and staff.
- 2. Here's the link to the **Oberlin master calendar** that outlines cohort rotations, remote learning days, and asynchronous days.
 - a. Cohort C/3 (6-8th graders) return on Monday, November
 9 for that week with the exception of Wednesday,
 November 11 which is a Holiday for all students.
 - b. Cohort A/1 (6th-8th graders) return on Monday,
 November 16 for that week with the exception of
 Wednesday, November 18 which is an asynchronous day.
 - c. Cohort B/2 (6th-8th graders) return on Monday,
 November 30 for that week with the exception of
 Wednesday, December 2 which is an asynchronous day.
 - d. The rotation continues in this order throughout the first semester.
- 3. Here is the list of asynchronous days and remote learning days.
 - a. Asynchronous Days Wednesday, November 18, Wednesday,
 December 2, Wednesday, December 16, Wednesday, January 6,
 Wednesday, January 13
 - b. Remote Learning Days Monday, November 23, Tuesday, November 24, Friday, December 11

- 5. Dr. Ashlie Thompson, Central Area Superintendent, has shared that she anticipates a candidate for the position of **Oberlin Magnet Middle School Principal** will go to the WCPSS School Board for approval on Tuesday, November 10. A start date has not yet been determined.
- 6. As families with students in the **cohorts prepare to return** for the weekly rotations, we ask you to be mindful of the following:
 - a. **Morning drop-off** all students will have to pass the "health screening" each morning before being allowed to get out of their car, leave the bus, and enter the building. Walkers will need to report to the cafeteria entrance at the mini-loop for their health screening.
 - b. The <u>health screening</u> consists of a temperature check and responding to questions about Covid exposure and related symptoms. Please know that as a result of these screenings, carpool wait time may be slightly longer at first.
 - c. **Carpool Tags** each car will need to have a tag displayed so that staff can call your student to the car in the afternoon. You may pickup a carpool tag in the main office between the hours of 8:00 and 3:00. Your child will need to remember his/her carpool number.
