

Heritage Elementary Reading Fair Project Guidelines

- Signup must be completed by the due date in order to participate in the Reading Fair.
- Participant should choose a book on their reading level. This means the participant will need to read the book.
- Only two story boards of the same title are allowed, so please turn in your entry form early.
- All entries should represent a <u>fictional</u> book.
- Participant must design and make a story board using the attached checklist. All items must be included on the storyboard.
- Storyboards must be original. Ideas can be found by Googling or Pinterest Reading Fairs
- ❖ Storyboard will need to be displayed on a standard tri-fold project board that measures 36" H x 48" W. These can be found at the Dollar Tree and office supply stores.
- Identifying information will need to be written on the back of the storyboard. This will include student name, teacher name, and grade level.
- Storyboards should be colorful and interesting. All display items should fit on the tri-fold or in the middle of the display. Nothing should hang off the display table or on the floor.
- Writing can be handwritten or typed.

Please Note: Storyboard content should match the age, grade level, and the ability of the student presenting the display.

- Electrical cords will not be available or allowed for presentation of material.
- Participant must have storyboard set up before judging begins in order to compete.
- Student must be present to win!

Writing:

- Writing is neat and inviting.
- Writing is easily understood.

Creativity:

- Project is original.
- Project demonstrates imagination.
- Unique materials are used to express ideas.

Quality of Project:

- Storyboard should match the age, grade level and the ability of the student presenting
- Project is durable and can stand up through judging.

Thoroughness of Written Information:

- Project captures the most important information.
- Project captures the concept/point the author made in the book.

Interest Evoked:

Project demonstrates student's ability. Project encourages others to read the book
 Project attracts others and makes them interested in the work.

Reading Fair Fiction Rubric

- o Author's Purpose-why the author wrote the story (to entertain, inform, and/or persuade)
- \circ Tone or Mood-describes how the author wants the reader to feel while reading the story (4th and 5th grade only)
