Staggered Entry: August 29-31, 2022

During the first week of school, **all** kindergarten students will participate in **Kindergarten Staggered Entry** by **coming to school for just one day**. This allows students to acclimate to school in a small group, and serves as an opportunity for our teachers to assess students' social, physical, and academic needs.

- First Day for ALL Kindergarten Students: Tuesday, September 6
- **Transportation:** For staggered entry, children may ride the bus, walk, or come through carpool.
- **Times:** Students will attend during normal school hours from 8:45 am until 3:45 pm.
- **Lunch:** Students may bring a lunch or purchase a lunch in the cafeteria for a cost of \$2.75.

Key Questions about Staggered Entry

All rising kindergarten students will receive a welcome letter the first week in August, which will outline each student's specific Staggered Entry Date.

- How do I drop my child off on the first day of school?
- How will my student find his/her way in the morning?
- What if my child needs help in the cafeteria?
- What items/supplies should my child bring with him/her on the first day?

- 30 additional minutes of small group learning in both ELA and math

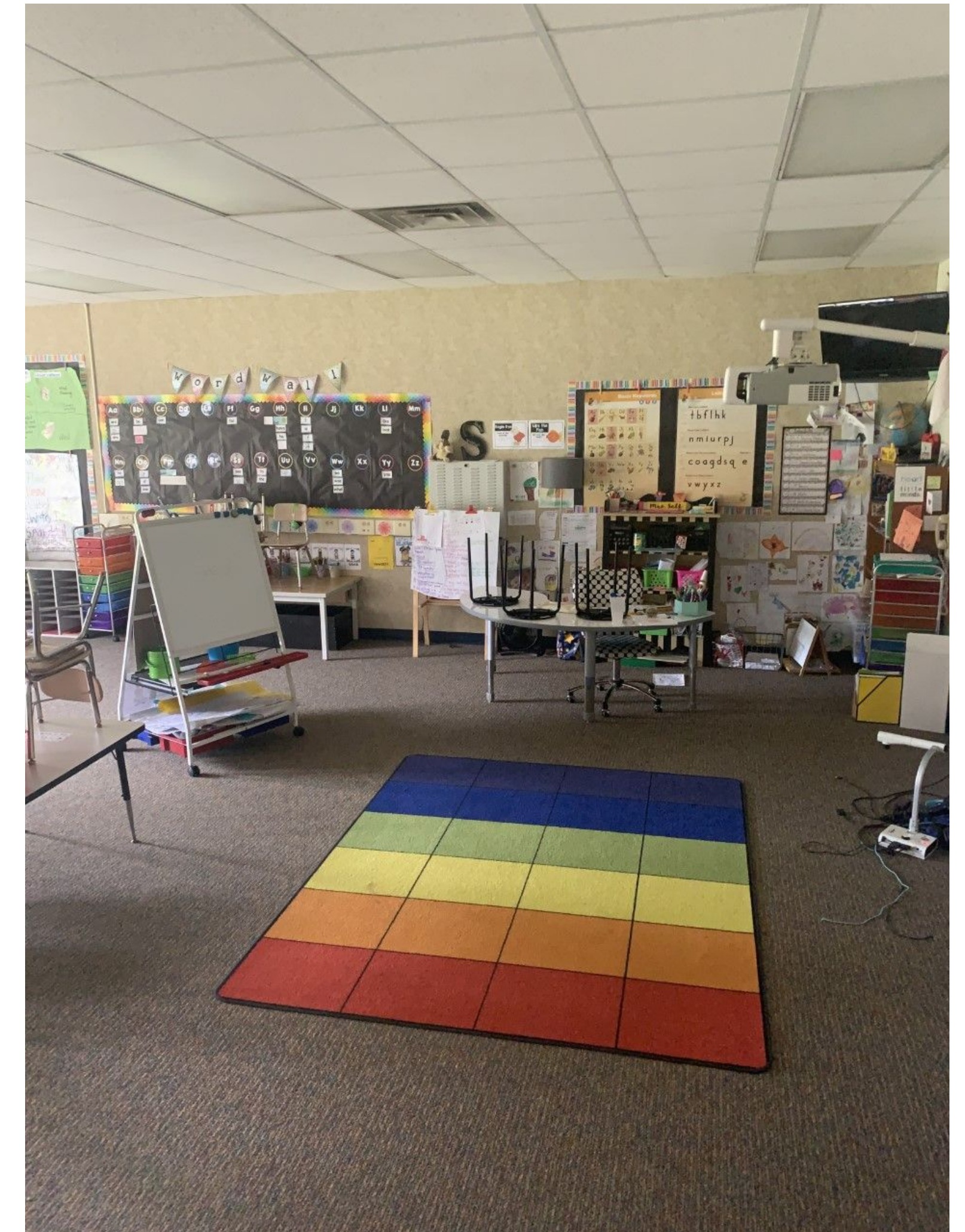

Arrival/Dismissal

AM Carpool

- Parents may drop their children off at the carpool curb at 8:45 am.
- The instructional bell rings at 9:15 am.

PM Carpool

- Carpool pickup begins at 3:45 pm.



Register for carpool number in Front Office. As soon as you get your number in the fall, start practicing with your child.

Riding the School Bus

- **Bus routes** will be published on our website in August.
- All kindergarten students will be tagged with bus and school information.
- When you register for kindergarten, register to ride the bus. The assistant principal and data manager can assist.
- Students can only ride the route assigned to them based on their address.

Before and After School Care

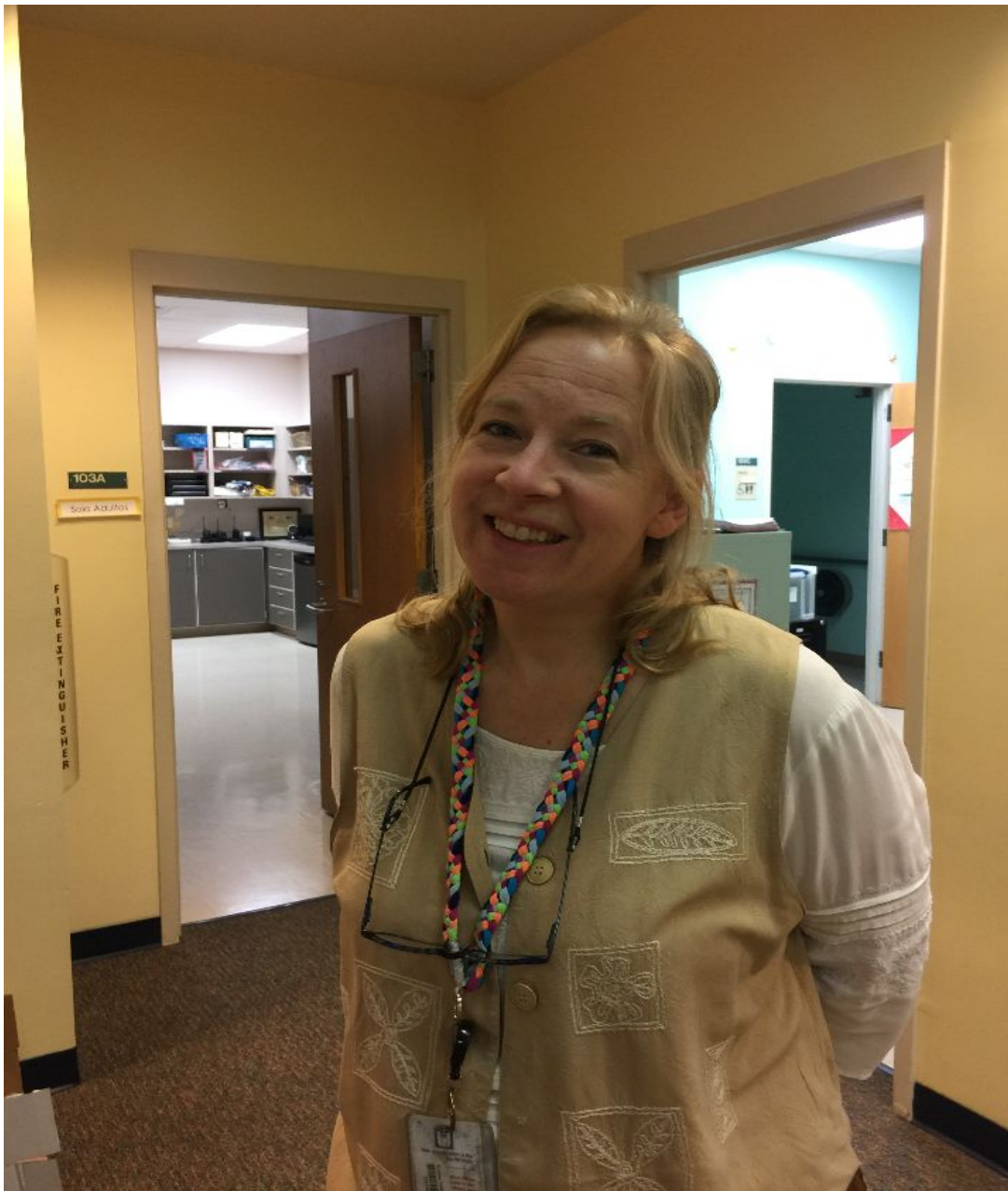
Before School Care at Baileywick

Helpful Hints to Prepare for Kindergarten

- Read to your child each day.
- Sing nursery rhymes.
- Count objects in your home, at the store, outside, etc.
- Encourage your child to color.
- Have a picnic and allow your child to use their “new” lunchbox.
- Practice buttoning/zipping clothes and tying shoes.
- Practice a quick entry/departure from the car and being able to fasten/unfasten car seats.
- Practice fine motor skills – play doh, legos, buttons, zippers, cutting activities
