#### \*\*\*\*IMPORTANT TRANSFER INFORMATION\*\*\*\*

Board Policy: 4150. D. 4. Revocation of Transfers

The superintendent or designee may revoke a transfer and return a student to his or her base school assignment for excessive absences or tardies, significant disciplinary infractions, or if it is determined that a transfer was granted or renewed based on false information submitted by the parent or guardian.

#### **RESTORATIVE PRACTICES:**

SCORE Academy will utilize this system of support to proactively build relationships, and help students respond to conflicts, problems, and wrongdoing in an atmosphere of safety, decorum, and equality. This is a project through the Campbell Law School Restorative Justice program. Students who are chosen to participate will be asked to come on campus to participate. Parents will be asked to transport.

#### **ON-CAMPUS EXPECTATIONS:**

SCORE Academy has several unique requirements if students choose to attend classes at the FLEX site in Cary:

- No backpacks or bags are allowed
- Students must check in and out via Identa-kid system
- All cellphones will be checked in and held in a locked shelf during class time
- Students are required to ask permission to move about the building
- Seating is assigned daily

#### **DISCIPLINE**

Students must follow all WCPSS policies and procedures which are outlined in the Parent/Student Handbook on the WCPSS website – <a href="http://www.wcpss.net/parents/handbook/">http://www.wcpss.net/parents/handbook/</a>

Students attending class at the FLEX building are expected to behave in similar fashion to that of a traditional school setting. Common expectations include:

- Limit phone use to non-instructional time...before/after school and lunch only
- Keep the talking to a minimum.
- Refrain from visiting websites that are not pertinent to the lesson
- Once students are checked in, they may not leave before the end of the day unless they are checked out by a parent
- Respectful interactions with adults and peers

SCORE Academy reserves the right to limit student's time on-campus if their behavior is distracting, disrespectful, or unsafe.

#### **EQUIPMENT & SUPPLIES**

Students are issued all needed equipment at their student orientation session. This may include a laptop, headphones, and a WiFi card. Students are responsible for all loaned equipment, including cost of replacement if lost or broken. All loaned equipment MUST BE RETURNED at the end of the semester/year. Fees will be posted in PowerSchool and will transfer to the student's base school if not paid before returning.

#### **HOME BASE STUDENT PORTAL ACCOUNTS**

PowerSchool is available to all students while participating in the SCORE Academy. Students and parents may access PowerSchool to check attendance and grades. Upon request students' PowerSchool login instructions will be distributed and passwords can be reset during a SCORE Orientation session. Students and parents should create a PowerSchool account <a href="https://wcpss.powerschool.com/public/">https://wcpss.powerschool.com/public/</a> on their phone and/or computer to view grades. SCORE Academy staff can assist in the process if needed.

#### **STUDENT ATTENDANCE**

Students are expected to begin class on the *day following their orientation session*. Each teacher takes daily period attendance in PowerSchool. Simply logging in is *NOT* the same as being present for class! If there is no response from a student when called on, then he/she can be marked absent! When students are logged in, they should be ACTIVE PARTICIPANTS in the class. If students are chronically absent, teachers and/or the SCORE counselor will contact parents.

Attendance is reported on a daily basis. Students are responsible for making up the content of missed academic work. Daily participation is monitored and reported. Students follow the WCPSS attendance policy while enrolled at SCORE Academy. Students attend class by logging into the Canvas Conference, GradPoint, and/or APEX course(s). Classes are 70 minutes. Students are considered tardy if logged in 5 minutes after class begins. Students will be marked absent if there is no response for 35 minutes.

#### **RE-ENROLLING AT BASE SCHOOL**

All students are required to re-enroll in their base school. Parents should contact the registrar at their base school to determine enrollment requirements and if an appointment is needed.

#### **GRADING**

Under the 10-point scale, all grades will be reported as numerical values. Grades and grade point average calculations will be applied as follows:

A: 90-100 = 4 QP B: 80-89 = 3 QP C: 70-79 = 2 QP D: 60-69 = 1 QP F: < 59 = 0 QP	0 QP
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All grades will be reported on the transcript as numeric grades. The quality-points (**QP**) standard will provide an additional .5 quality point to Honors courses and a 1.0 additional quality point to Advanced Placement, community colleges courses, or four-year university or college courses taken in high school. This standard provides the same additional quality point to all college-level coursework. Students may be assigned a grade of "Inc" (Incomplete) if, because of an emergency, they do not complete the work by the end of the grading period. The incomplete will become an F (reported as the last numerical average calculated), if work is not finished within two weeks of the quarter's end.

#### **GradPoint Courses**

Students attempting to earn credit via credit recovery (GradPoint) are required to complete 100% of the course to earn a (P). Anything less will result in an F on the report card/transcript. During orientation, students and parents will receive a breakdown of the modules required to finish each course. If a student has started a credit recovery course at their base school, they should ask for their modules to be transferred to SCORE Academy.

#### **Reporting of Grades**

Teachers update grades weekly. Progress in credit recovery courses will be documented as percent completed, as the

final grades for credit recovery courses are marked as a P/F (pass/fail) only.

#### Homework

Homework will not be more than 10% of a students' grade. Homework is assigned to:

- 1) Enrich and extend school experiences through related home activities and
- 2) Reinforce learning by providing practice and application.

#### Make-up Work

Make-up work will be accepted throughout the quarter with deductions at the discretion of the teacher, not to be below 50%. Quarter deadlines for make-up work: **Q1**-9/24, 10/29; **Q2**-12/03, 1/11; **Q3**-2/11, 3/18; **Q4**-5/6, 6/7

Late work due to an excused absence will follow the WCPSS make up work policy: If the make-up work has not been assigned in advance, for excused absences of 1-3 days, the student will have 1 day for each day absent. For absences exceeding 3 days, the student may have 2 days for each day absent to make up work. Special consideration will be given in the case of extended absences due to injury or chronic illness.

#### **Testing**

Parents/Guardians are responsible for ensuring that students participate in the North Carolina State Testing Program. Parents are responsible for transportation to and from testing. The testing schedule is communicated via letter, classroom teachers, and e-mails to parents & students.

#### **Exams**

In all courses with an End-of-Course (EOC) test, the EOC test will count as 20% of the student's final grade. Performance on the non-EOC final exams, including North Carolina Final Exams (NCFE) and all Elements (CTE) testing count as (20%) of the final grade. #### **CALENDAR**


