TYPES OF CREDIT

The workshops listed in this brochure have been approved by the Wake County Public School System, the Council for Early Childhood Professional Recognition, and by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Child Development and Early Education for the following credits:

- **eSchools** All WCPSS employees can receive eSchools credit for all teacher workshops. All eSchools credits are calculated as follows: 10 hours of workshops = 1.0 credit
- **Teacher Renewal (CEU's)** Teacher Renewal CEU's are available for participants that currently hold a North Carolina Teaching Certificate and are not WCPSS employees. All Teacher Renewal CEU's are calculated as follows: 10 hours of workshops = 1.0 CEU credit.
- **Staff Development (CDA and Contact Hours Credit)** All other participants may receive Staff Development (CDA and CHC Credit Hours) credit that is calculated as follows: 1 hour of workshop = 1 Staff Development Credit.

<u>Special Note:</u> Participants who miss 15 minutes or more of a workshop will not receive a certificate or credit for the class.

END OF YEAR CREDIT CERTIFICATES

Upon request, Project Enlightenment offers two types of summary credit certificates at the end of the school year: **Teacher Renewal Credits (CEU's)** and **Staff Development (CDA and Contact Hours Credit)**. The summary certificate titled "*Creating Positive Learning Environments for Young Children*" will contain the accumulated hours of attendance for the 2017- 2018 school year and the equivalent of CEU or credit hours. About Project Enlightenment



Project Enlightenment, established in 1969, is a comprehensive early childhood education and early intervention program of the Wake County Public School System. Project Enlightenment's approach is to give parents, teachers, and caregivers knowledge and skills to help young children, birth through kindergarten age, be successful in school and life.

With a focus on development, learning, and social and emotional growth, Project Enlightenment provides education, consultation, resources, information, and support to those adults most important in a young child's life.

Project Enlightenment is funded by the Wake County Public School System, Wake County Smart Start, contracts, grants, fees and contributions. The program operates on a traditional school-year calendar with limited services available during July and August. Our services include:

Teacher Parent Consultation

Project Enlightenment provides consultation in early childhood classrooms around individual children. With parent permission, teachers who have a concern about a child can contact Project Enlightenment and request the appropriate forms. A Project Enlightenment consultant will work with the teacher and the parent(s) to address the child's needs. These services are available to all public kindergarten classrooms as well as Wake County residents enrolled in preschool and child care facilities in Wake County. Developmental Screening

Screening services are available when concerns arise about a child's development in areas such as speech, language, and learning. If an area of significant need is identified, recommendations for intervention or for evaluation can be made. Parents can make appointments for screening by calling 919.694.8993.

The PTRC houses a variety of resources, equipment, and materials for parents and teachers. Resources include a library and video collection of over 10,000 items, exhibits of various age-appropriate activities, and a Production Area.

Preschool Classrooms for Four-Year-Olds

Project Enlightenment offers two innovative preschool classrooms, the Demonstration Preschool (**DPS**) classroom and the Blended Classroom (**BC**).

- The Blended Classroom (BC), combines NC PreK, Title 1 and special education pre-kindergarten. As a full-day program, it emphasizes research-based early literacy practices in an inclusive environment.
- The Demonstration Preschool (DPS) classroom is an inclusive half-day pre-kindergarten classroom. It serves both children with developmental concerns and typically developing children.

Through planned observation classes (see the Guided Observations of the *Preschool Classrooms section*) the two preschool classrooms serve as training centers to help teachers and child care providers develop positive strategies for enhancing their own classrooms.

Teacher Training

Workshops for early childhood teachers and child care providers are available throughout the school year. Fees vary according to the number of sessions. CEU, Staff Development/CDA/CHC and teacher renewal credits are offered. Refer to the "<u>About Teacher Workshops</u>" section for further credit information. Parent Classes


