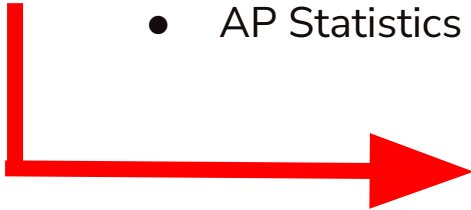

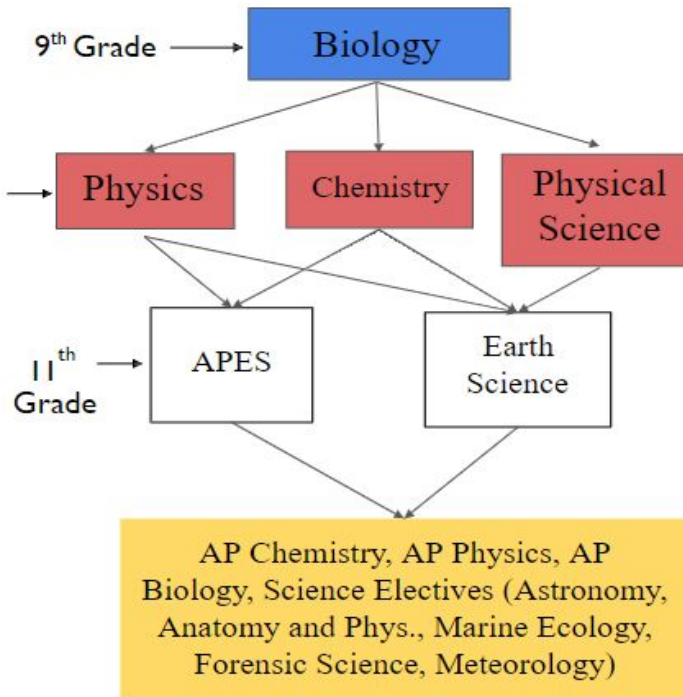
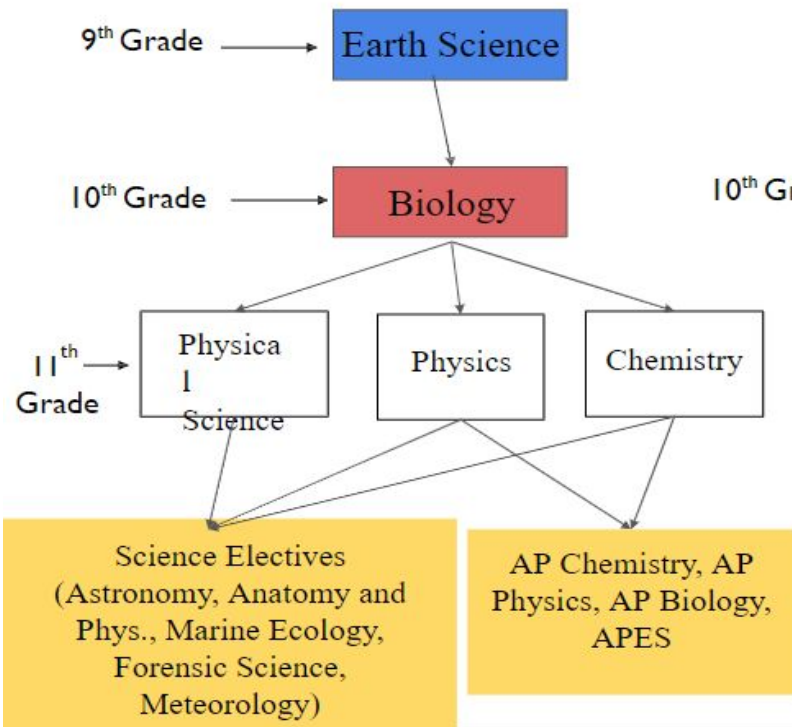

Typical Sequence of course

- Year 1: Levels 1 & 2
 - Now Honors Credit
- Year 2: Levels 3 & 4
- Year 3: Levels 5 & AP

Things to Consider:

- Take courses over back to back semesters (fall/spring) if possible
- It is not recommended that students progress beyond Level 2 with a grade lower than C
- World Languages are not required for graduation, but are recommended for college eligibility



UNC System Regarding World Languages for College Admission

For students applying for first-time (freshman) admission to constituent institutions after the 2024 spring semester:

- *Two additional academic courses from English, mathematics, science, social studies, world languages or computer science.
(Note: these courses should be selected in alignment with a student's academic and career objectives. Completion of two sequential world language courses is recommended.)*

This applies to NC public colleges and universities only. Private and out-of-state institutions may still require world language credits for admissions.

Get a head start on college classes tuition free through Wake Tech Community College

Other Information

- Courses online or in person
- Only courses worth 3 or more credits
- Courses will factor into your GPA
- Students can have early release or late arrival.
- Seniors must have two classes on AFHS campus.
- Juniors must have four classes total, with at least 2 on AFHS campus.

- **You can't be on campus during scheduled CCP times**
- **Can't guarantee parking for CCP**
- **AFHS courses take priority and should not conflict**
- **CCP semesters and AFHS don't line up.**
 - **Wake Tech fall semester begins before WCPSS semester**
 - **Wake Tech's spring semester begins while we are finishing up our first semester.**

NCVPS-Online Courses

Please remember to sign up for 1 & 2

- Very limited course options
- Only available for classes we do not offer here
- Class must be approved by Wake County Public Schools
- Must be taken on campus in a classroom
- To sign up, you must have a conversation with your counselor
- Students must:
 - Be self motivated and independent learners
 - Possess strong reading and comprehension skills





Early Release/Late Arrival

- Available to seniors that will meet graduation requirements
- You must have at least 2 classes each semester
- For now, you will still register for 8 primary and 4 alternates
- **Priority Deadline: Forms due by March 28th so we may schedule around your requested periods off**
- Some colleges/universities frown upon reduced schedules
- Athletes must take three classes the semester before your season to maintain athletic eligibility
 - Ex. You must pass three classes in the fall semester for a spring sport.
- **You cannot be on the AFHS campus when you do not have a class!**





Mid year vs Early Graduation



Mid-year (1 Semester Early)

- Seniors needing 4 or less credits to graduate can graduate in Jan
- Form due by March 28th (Jr year)
- Students are allowed to participate in Jan and/or June graduation ceremony



Early (1 Year Early)

- Students showing a mastery of high school academic skills/concepts
- Able to meet all graduation requirements by the end of their junior year
- Form due by March 28th (Soph year)
- Students must meet with their school counselor to discuss the appropriateness of this option considering their intended post-secondary plan



Last Minute Reminders

- Take your time and choose **carefully**
- Follow Recommendations
- Look up course descriptions and prerequisites before signing up for a class
- Do not select the same courses for your alternates.
- **Minimal** course adjustments will be made during 2025-2026 when you have received the courses you registered for
- Again, **carefully** select your 8 courses & 4 alternates
