

# Just Do It!

- College costs money Lots of \$\$\$\$
- FAFSA & CSS Profile applications "Gateway to Financial Aid"
- Colleges have "priority deadlines" for financial aid some as early as 11/1, so be sure to check colleges' websites
- FAFSA opens 10/1 each year complete it early!
- Lastly...don't procrastinate...getting started early can pay dividends later on!

# RISING SENIORS...IT'S GO TIME!

- Complete your final financial aid planning
- Start looking for scholarships
  - Scholarship Search Resources
  - AFHS Scholarship Document (list of scholarships updated throughout the year)
- Explore all <u>Options for Financing College</u>
- <u>FAFSA/CSS Profile</u> application tax year is 2
   <u>years</u> prior to your college entrance date
  - Ex: College entrance is 2023 -->
     FAFSA/CSS Profile application information is based on 2021 tax year

# 7 Tips for a Successful Financial Aid Season

FSA ID	Get FSA ID for your FAFSA application - student & 1 parent
CSS Profile	Verify that your school doesn't need the CSS Profile - 5 schools in NC require it in addition to the FAFSA
Meet Deadlines	Get all financial aid done at least 1 week before the school's Priority deadline -if possible, have it ready by October 1st - FAFSA Application opens
EFC Calculator	Use the EFC Calculator to calculate how much aid you might receive
Apply	Always apply for aid, even if you don't think you'll get any - colleges want to see you've exhausted all federal aid prior to considering you for institutional aid.  Don't forget about Scholarship applications too
Verify	Verify your FAFSA SAR against your EFC predictions - double check your FAFSA application carefully
Check email & College Portals	Students need to set up usernames & passwords with college portals - to check admission status and financial aid status with the individual colleges

# Academic Performance

What is the potential for success in the college classroom?

#### Transcript

- Do course selections and class performance demonstrate
  - Preparation for college level work?
  - > Student took advantage of available rigor/ choose to challenge themselves?
- Level of academic rigor looked for depends on the college/program
- Senior schedule

#### Test Scores

- UNC System schools test-optional through Fall 2024
- For test-optional schools, scores can only enhance application
- Students are encouraged to test
- Not all schools are test optional

June 4 next **SAT** (<u>5/5 registration</u> <u>deadline</u>)


June 11 next **ACT** (5/6 registration deadline)



#### AFHS College Application Summer To-Do List

#### □ Narrow Down Your College List

It can be overwhelming to know where to begin, but using college search databases, like <u>Big Future</u>, <u>CFNC</u>, <u>College Simply</u> and <u>College Scorecard</u> can help you narrow down your college choices. <u>Consider what is important to you</u>-location, size, majors/programs offered, cost, activities, support services, study abroad opportunities, campus climate, research opportunities, etc.

- Exploring college websites and going on college visits can give you a feel for the college to determine if it is a good fit for you.
- Understanding your fit for the school is also important. Consider how your GPA and test scores compare to college acceptance ranges. Build a college list of 5-8 schools that includes safety, match, and reach schools.

#### Know the Admission Requirements

Some schools and programs have additional admission requirements. Make sure you know the requirements before the start of senior year in case you need to add an additional class such as an art, a fourth science, or a third foreign language. Military academies have separate requirements

#### □ Understand the College Application Process

- You can use <u>Common App</u> to apply to most colleges. Common App is a great tool to organize your college list and keep up with the <u>application requirements of different schools</u>. <u>Create a Common App account</u>, add colleges to your college list, and begin answering questions in these seven sections: Profile, Family, Education, Testing, Activities, Writing, and Courses & Grades. You can start on college specific questions on August 1st. View the <u>Common App YouTube channel</u> for tutorials.
- You can apply to North Carolina colleges or universities through <u>CFNC.org</u>. Even if you do not apply to colleges through CFNC, you will still need to <u>create a CFNC account</u> to complete your NC Residency Determination and to request final transcripts for NC colleges (more information to come on these items in the fall).
- Consider if you will apply Early Action, Early Decision, or Regular Decision.

#### ☐ Start Preparing Application Materials Compile a list of activities, honors, awards, special experiences, and talents/skills and create a resume. Common App only allows 150 characters to describe an activity. See how to make the most of your Common App Activity List. To give your resume a boost, consider Summer Enrichment activities such as summer. programs, employment, or an internship, or volunteer your time this summer. Start drafting your personal statement-who are you, what is your career goal, and what interests you about the major you plan to study? What is a story about you that you want to share with colleges? Draft that story. The essay is an essential element of the application. Please review the AFHS Student Services presentations, Presenting Your Best Self and College Essay Writing Clinic. Also, see the How to Approach the Common App Essay and free resources from the College Essay Guy. Not all schools require a letter of recommendation, but if you apply to a school that does, consider who can give a well-rounded picture of you and speak to contributions you've made to the classroom and/or to the community? A recommender may ask you for a resume or "brag sheet." Be intentional about the information you provide on the brag sheet and give specific examples of the characteristics you hope your recommender will emphasize. Also, be sure to practice good etiquette when requesting recommendation letters (formally request the recommendation well in advance, supply necessary information, give friendly reminders, say thank you).

#### ☐ Prep for the SAT and/or ACT

☐ If needed, register to take the <u>SAT</u> or <u>ACT</u> over the summer or in the fall to boost scores for college admissions or scholarship opportunities. Although some colleges are test optional next year, most colleges will still accept and consider your scores if they enhance your application. Take advantage of <u>free SAT</u> prep or <u>free ACT</u> prep before your next test.





**Manage Expectations** 

- Dream Match Safe Schools → 5 8 schools
- What can I get from the school?



Change the Conversation

- **Enjoy the "now"**
- Focus on mental health and well-being



Validate - but do not fix

- Acknowledge feelings and reassure
- Allow for the chance to build resiliency



Avoid

- Tunnel vision & catastrophic thinking
- **Comparing to others**



# Class of 2023 \*\*ACTION REQUIRED \*\*

As of 2020, state law mandates that ALL seniors must have their second Meningitis vaccination before they begin their senior year.

Please submit a copy of your immunizations, showing the Meningitis vaccinations, via email to: <a href="mailto:apexfriendshiphs-student-sevices@wcpss.net">apexfriendshiphs-student-sevices@wcpss.net</a> or you can fax to: 919-694-0525.

This proof must be received from each rising senior BEFORE the first day of the 2022-23 school year. Link to Meningitis vaccination information, K-12 Health Requirements.
