Transportation Tags

All kindergartners will be provided a tag for their backpack on their first day of staggered entry. This tag will include their name and identify their afternoon transportation (Bus, Carpool, etc). Bus tags will include the bus stop location.

Arrival Procedures

(7:45 – 8:15 am)

- Children may not arrive at school until 7:45 AM
- Carpool and buses begin unloading at 7:45 AM
- At 8:10 AM a "Ready to Learn" bell rings. The expectation is that all students will be in their classrooms at 8:10 AM.
- After 8:15 AM, a parent needs to escort a child to the office.
- Any child whose absence is marked unexcused will receive an automated message.

Dismissal Procedures

- Dismissal begins at 3:00 PM.
- Bus tweets @hilburnacademy & WPSS Bus App
- Students always go home the same way unless we have a note from their parents.
- Notify school of transportation changes before 2:30 PM.
- Buses cannot accommodate sending friends home with a child
- No student check out after 2:45 PM.

Dismissal Procedures

 At the beginning of the year, Kindergarten teachers and TA's escort students to designated areas based on their mode of transportation. Staff in these areas assist them in getting home

Kindergarten Meet the Teacher

Friday, August 31, 2018 *1:00 PM - 1:30 PM*

Class assignments made after staggered entry is completed.

You and your child find out his/her teacher on this day.

What is Staggered Entry?

- Monday, August 27 Thursday, August 30
- Staggered Entry is a full day.
- Your child only attends school I day this week. You will receive a letter this summer with your child's entry date and Student ID#.
- Staggered Entry is aimed to ease the transition into Kindergarten for children (and parents)

What do kids do at Staggered Entry?

- Smaller group sizes allow teachers to offer individual attention and support as children try new things.
- Assessments are integrated into the day through play and practice.
- These assessments, along with observations that teachers make over the first weeks of school, allow teachers to plan your child's instruction.

Helpful Hints for Staggered Entry

- Talk to your child about how she/he will go home in the afternoon.
- Talk about snack and lunch have your child practice opening up milk cartons and juice boxes, pack/unpack bookbags
- Allow plenty of time in the morning to get to school

Prepare for the first day....

- Be positive your attitude determines your child's attitude
- Communicate send back important papers
- Get plenty of rest, and expect tired children in the afternoon!
- Give your child a chance to relax before asking specific questions about his or her day

Combat the First Day Jitters

- Show your excitement!
- Read books about the first day of school (next slide)
- Create something to give the teacher
- Begin a similar schedule (eating, sleeping)
- Pack a lunch and practice at home
- Review behavior expectations
- Plan for a quick goodbye routine

Attendance

- Early grades is a time when it is most critical for students to be in school so they can build the necessary foundational academic and social skills needed for later school success.
- Research shows that chronic absences in Kindergarten and/or First Grade are predictors of long-term reduced levels of school achievement.
- Good Attendance: 9 or fewer absences/tardies/early pick-ups
- Warning Signs: 10 17 absences/tardies/early pick-ups
- Chronic Absence: 18 or more absences/tardies/early pick-ups

Preparing your child for Kindergarten

<u>Academics</u>

Recognize letters in their name

Be familiar with a book Write name with first letter capital and the rest lowercase

Count to 10 Practice singing the alphabet

Be able to sit and listen to an entire story being read



Communicate needs

Use restroom independently

Put jackets on/off

Self-regulation of behavior

Practice opening own lunch containers and eat a meal within 25 minutes

Routines, responsibility, accountability

Birthdays & Celebrations

- As much as we like celebrating birthdays with parties, sweets, and balloons, we cannot have these kinds of celebrations at school.
- Contact your child's teacher to consider healthy and alternatives instead.
- Parents should always contact their child's teacher before showing up with birthday surprises.

School Nurse

 Hilburn has an assigned Wake County Health and Human Services nurse on campus 2 days a week.

Kindergarten Health Assessment

- Parents/guardians have 30 calendar days from the first day of attendance to present written proof of required immunizations and the physician completed kindergarten health assessment.
- The child CAN be excluded from school until proof is provided.
- If you have questions about your child's immunizations please contact the school prior to the start date

Medications

- Medications will be administered at school ONLY if a Physician Order for Medication form 1702 is completed.
- These forms are available at the front office and online at www.wcpss.net
- All medications must be brought to school by parents/guardians.

Sick Children

- Your child must stay home for 24 hours after she/he has had a fever
- Students should also stay home if they've experienced symptoms such as:
 - Red, watery eyes with yellow drainage
 - Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
 - Severe headache
 - Undiagnosed rash
- Please call the office if your child will be out sick. You will also need to send a written note to your child's teacher when she/he returns.
