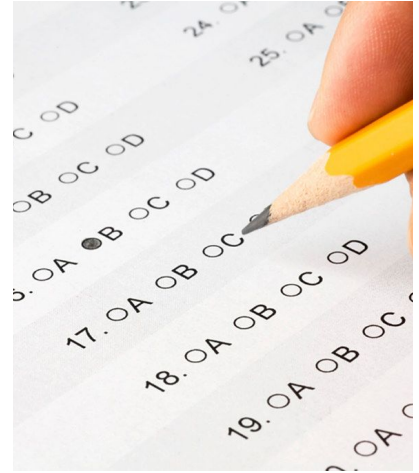

Seniors: A great way to start your preparation for College Application Week [Countdown to College/October 21-October 25] is by creating your free account on CFNC.org. To be eligible for in-state tuition, state grants, and certain financial aid, you must show that you are a resident of North Carolina. Go to www.ncresidency.org to complete your residency determination, also known as RDS. This is important regardless of what college or university you may attend in North Carolina. You will use the same username and password for www.ncresidency.org and www.CFNC.org.

SENIORS: Get help completing your online application to North Carolina colleges and universities. During the 3rd week of North Carolina Countdown to College Month [October 21-25] the following North Carolina colleges and universities will waive the application fee for all North Carolina high school seniors applying online through CFNC.org. Broughton will be participating in the statewide week on Tuesday, October 22, but the Wade Edwards Learning Lab [WELL] will be participating all five days.
