The PSAT will be offered to registered Sophomores and Juniors on Wednesday, October 16 during periods 1A-3A. There is a fee of \$17 to take the assessment, but 11th grade students with a GPA at or above 4.3125 can take the test for free. The online registration window for testing will open on 9/23 and will close 10/4. Students can register in-person 9/23, 9/25, 10/1, or 10/2. *Students with >4.3125 GPA should register in-person.* All other students can register online or in-person.
