ASVAB Career Assessment (November 9):

Have you ever thought about HOW YOU ARE SMART rather than how smart you are?

Sometimes strengths cannot be identified in traditional tests, so get to know yourself and determine a career that is fulfilling! Take the ASVAB. This career assessment is FREE for students who are serious about their futures! Any Juniors or Seniors interested in joining the military must take the ASVAB entrance exam, but this test does NOT mean that you have to enter the military if you take the test. Only 10th-12th graders are eligible to take the assessment. The test will be given on Friday, November 9 at 7:25am in the Media Center. The complete test, including instruction time, takes about 3 hours. Students should report to the media center before 7:25 am and be prompt! Students should sign up for the test with the following link (www.tinyurl.com/ASVABnov9) or should sign up with Ms. Davis in the Career Development Office (1406-c).
