The North Carolina Business Committee for Education has launched a new statewide app challenge: Ready, Set, App. Ready, Set, App is a high school mobile app development competition sponsored by Lenovo. In addition to providing students with exposure to computer science and experience in app development, the competition aims to help them develop their entrepreneurial and problem-solving skills and strengthen their interpersonal and soft skills. The competition is designed for high school students regardless of their experience with coding. Student groups will be given the resources they need to be successful in the competition. Students will create an Android mobile app using MIT App Inventor to solve problems in their school or community. We will select winners in each economic development zone and these regional winners will travel to Raleigh to participate in a "shark-tank-like" pitch competition. Hotel and travel expenses will be covered for the regional winners and teacher and the top 3 teams will receive laptops, tablets, and VR headsets from Lenovo. Industry professionals and leaders in the comp sci departments at State and UNC will be the judges. After the competition and awards luncheon, students and teachers will participate in a breakout sessions on entrepreneurship and computer science. This is a fantastic opportunity for students.
