GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Nigeria: Small nonprofits are helping improve maternal health in rural Nigeria. United Nations agencies estimated that 23% of global maternal deaths in 2017 occurred in Nigeria, Africa's most populous country, with more than 900 deaths per 100,000 births. These issues are especially pronounced in rural areas, where communities often lack health facilities or the ability to afford treatment. Hacey Health Initiative's Project Agbebi has trained community birth attendants and distributed more than 50,000 free birthing kits - containing sterile blades, gloves, and other essentials - and over 100,000 mosquito nets to help prevent malaria.
