GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Colombia: For the first time, former members of the FARC rebel group have apologized for kidnappings and other war crimes committed during Colombia's decadeslong civil war. A 2016 peace agreement ended the violence, but until now, many ex-guerrillas have been reluctant to acknowledge their specific crimes. Eight top commanders of the now-disbanded group signed an apology, acknowledging the kidnappings were an "extremely grave mistake" and asking victims' families for forgiveness. Experts say this is an important step forward in a long reconciliation process.
