**GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Spain: Spain's government recently expanded laws targeting the gender pay gap.** The new decree establishes a framework for comparing the objective value of different jobs and requires companies to provide the gender breakdown of employee wages. Workplaces that fail to disclose the latter face fines up to \$220,000. The change comes as the coronavirus pandemic threatens to exacerbate the pay gap in many countries.
