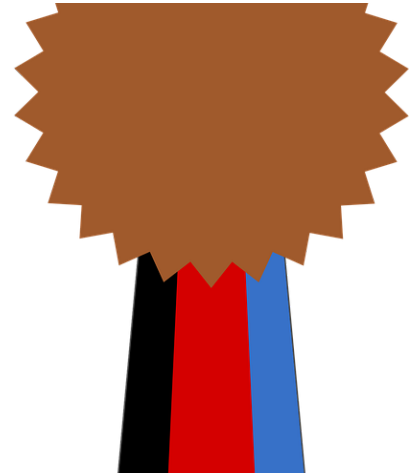

RISING AP ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE STUDENTS: You may pick up your summer assignment in Ms. Woodall's room 353 on Thursday May 16 during first lunch or after school. If you are unable to attend one of these brief sessions, access the assignment via the Broughton website-Academics-Advanced Placement.

Colleges are looking at all the ways students distinguish themselves in addition to their GPA. Community Service is becoming an even more important criteria. Our goal is to help create a spirit of giving back AND help students achieve academic and professional success. We still have some spots open for our highly rated Summer Programs (Leadership Institute for Civic Engagement and the IMPACT Camp).

- The IMPACT Camp is extremely hands on as students visit and serve at a different nonprofit each day. (They earn 40 service hours in this camp.)
- The Leadership Institute delves more into the academics of service. What makes a Civil Society & why is it important? Students hear from community leaders and create their own Capstone project. (Students earn 45 service hours in the Institute.) There is also still time for students to register and turn in school-related service hours (earning the Commissioners' Award) as well as registering for the Mayor's Award for service this summer. The National President's Service Award (highest volunteer service award in the country) recognizes year round service. Last year we had over 200 students earning this award.
