GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Colombia: The country has welcomed Venezuelan migrants over the past few years. While Colombia's resources have been strained by the recent influx of immigrants as the crisis in Venezuela worsens, it has nevertheless set a high standard for absorbing millions of displaced people. The government's efforts to integrate and register migrants have drawn the attention of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, which is currently seeking funding to support Colombia's efforts. Experts say Colombia is motivated in part by its own history with forced migration, in which millions fled the country's decades-long civil war.
