GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Philippines: The Philippines is launching a new mobile app to combat wildlife trafficking, an illegal trade estimated at \$1billion a year that threatens the country's biodiversity. Currently, Filipinos can report suspected wildlife trafficking incidents through a Department of Environment and Natural Resources hotline, but a lack of cellphone reception or species knowledge can pose barriers to reporting. The WildAlert app is designed to empower anyone, in any part of the country, to fight the illegal wildlife trade.

<u>AP Students:</u> All students taking AP courses will receive the "join code" for the correct section of their teacher's online section of their AP Classroom. Students must log in to their AP/College Board account and join their teacher's section. If the student does not have an AP/College Board account, they will need to create one.

How to create an AP account

**Once a student "joins" the AP Classroom, they will automatically be registered for the AP exam in the Spring. All students must register for the AP exam by October 30th

**Exams are free for any student that is registered/enrolled in the AP course. No further action is needed after they join their AP Classroom

NC Countdown to College 2020 Events: Join CFNC for <u>a month of live virtual events</u> and How-To videos to support high school seniors in completing three important college enrollment steps: Residency, FAFSA, and applications.

Things to Accomplish Weeks 1:

- 1. Create a MyCFNC account if you don't already have one.
- 2. Utilize Plan a Career tools and information to identify potential careers.
- 3. Find colleges that are right for you using <u>College Search</u> and <u>Explore Programs and Majors</u>. This will help you narrow down the list of colleges you will apply to later this month.
- 4. Apply for FSA IDs both the student and one of the parents need FSA IDs in order to complete and submit the FAFSA form in Week 2. (fsaid.ed.gov)

As NC Countdown to College begins, it's a good time to narrow down the list of colleges to which you'll apply. Join us to learn about CFNC career and major search tools to help you find colleges that match your career goals, and how to use the CFNC College Search tool. Bring your questions about careers and the admissions process, and we'll help you get started.

Things to Accomplish Week 2:

- Decide which schools you will apply to during College Application Weeks (10/19-10/30). Many NC colleges and universities waive their fees during these weeks. <u>See who</u>.
- Speak with counselors concerning fee waiver forms if applicable (ACT, College Board Fee Waiver) to use for schools that are not waiving fees during College Application Weeks.
- 3. Some applications require an essay or personal statement. Review application requirements for the schools you plan to apply to and prepare these in advance.
- 4. File your Free Application for Federal Financial Aid (<u>FAFSA</u>) after October 1st in order to begin the financial aid process for college. This one form allows you to apply for federal and state grants (free money for college), federal work-study, and federal student loans. Many colleges also require the FAFSA as part of the application process for institutional scholarships. <u>Review necessary documentation before getting started</u>.
- Complete the Residency Determination Service (<u>RDS</u>). This is important for both in-state tuition and financial aid, as the RDS application allows students to apply for in-state Residency, as well as North Carolina state grants. <u>Review necessary documentation before getting started</u>.

FAFSA & RDS go together like macaroni and cheese! Prepare to apply to college by completing both. Learn how to avoid the Top 10 FAFSA Errors and what you need to establish North Carolina Residency. Financial aid administrators and Residency Determination Service experts will be on hand for live chat, resources will be offered specific to your questions, and a short presentation every 15 minutes will help in case you don't even know what to ask.
