### AP Exam Registration for 2021-22

Students in AP courses must join their teacher's online "AP Classroom" to register for their corresponding AP exam in May. IB students interested in taking AP exams must pay online. Exams are \$96 each (fee reductions available for those who qualify). Register on the [OSP site link link](#) between Oct. 11th-22nd. Mr. Sauls will email each student their join code after they register and pay for their exams. AP exams are FREE for all AP students who are enrolled in the corresponding AP course and enrolled in their AP Classroom. No further action is needed.
