GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Canada: Chopsticks are proving that a circular business can be created from single-use products. The idea for a sustainable home furnishings company came to engineer Felix Bock after he had just given a seminar on sustainability in Vancouver, British Columbia, and a waiter threw away his chopsticks at a sushi restaurant. He began his startup, called ChopValue, creating coasters and cutting boards from disposed chopsticks, which are usually made of bamboo. Since then, the company has grown to a staff of 35 people; the team collects 350,000 chopsticks from restaurants in Vancouver each week -- 70 million in total across its operations so far.
