**GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - France:** France's Ministry of Ecological Transition announced a series of bans to improve animal welfare throughout the country. Traveling circuses will no longer be allowed to use wild animals such as tigers, bears, and elephants, and marine parks can no longer breed or obtain dolphins and orcas to keep in captivity. The new policies also bring an end to mink farming in France by 2025. The government is dedicating \$9.4 million to help marine parks transition into sanctuaries and find new jobs for circus and marine park workers.

Interested in East Tennessee State University? As you know, this week is CFNC college application week. In honor, ETSU is waiving the application fee for North Carolina students! As you may have already seen, we have reset our out-of-state tuition for NC students down to **\$10,500** per year (border counties still receive the in-state rate). Students can apply for free by going to [etsu.edu/apply](http://etsu.edu/apply) and using the application code **nbcucs21**. We are test optional therefore, we will only need their high school transcripts to deliver a decision. They can still submit their test scores for scholarship purposes.
