GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - World: Scientists have developed a technique for extracting precious and heavy metals from electronic waste. The mining of metals such as sodium, copper, and gold for consumer electronics has been linked to health issues, environmental pollution, and war. Most discarded devices end up in landfills; only 20% of hazardous electronic waste around the world is recycled. But a new method of "urban mining" improves upon traditional leaching and smelting recovery of these materials. The process uses a jolt of electricity to instantly heat e-waste to 5,660 degrees Fahrenheit, vaporizing the precious metals. The gases are then separated into a cold trap, where they condense into solid form.
