GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS -Cambodia: Inexpensive sonar devices are notifying villages when floods will happen. Cambodia has experienced many devastating floods in recent years. Often, warning texts are sent to help people in affected areas prepare. But while most people in Cambodia have both cell phones and cell service, about a quarter of those in rural areas are illiterate, or if they can read, their phones may not support the Khmer language. To fix the communication issue, a nongovernmental organization created a device that can be assembled with inexpensive parts and open-source software. It hangs from bridges and use sonar to measure the level of streams beneath; if the water rises, it causes and IVR warning to be sent to people in the flood zone. About 72,000 people are signed up to receive alerts.

December is national HIV/AIDS awareness month. In 2016 there were 26 deaths by the HIV virus in the Wake county area. Every week, around 7000 young women aged 15-24 become infected with HIV.
