SUMMER ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITY

The Martha Guy Summer Institute for Future Business Leaders at Appalachian State University [Program dates: July 7-July 27, 2019] offers a unique opportunity for current high school JUNIORS to gain an immeasurable amount of business knowledge and experience. Twenty-four [24] students <u>who have a sincere interest in</u> <u>business as a college major</u> will be selected to participate in the 16th cohort that will include two weeks of

classroom instruction, an entrepreneurial project, outdoor courses, and local activities. The program concludes with a week of travel to various business and cultural sites, including visiting Washington, DC and New York City. The application deadline is February 28, 2019. Seniors interested in having a "gap" year before going on to college: Broughton has been asked to nominate seniors for the Congress-Bundestag Vocational Youth Exchange Program. The Program is a special work/study program for recently-graduated U.S. high school students to spend a gap year in Germany. The scholarship offers 18-19 year olds the opportunity to learn the German language and culture, live with a host family, make life-long friends, and undertake internships in their fields of interest. Participants are required to bring between \$500-\$550 a month for spending money. A financial aid package may be available to help a well-deserving student with personal spending money, if needed in order to participate. All participants will receive two months of intensive language preparation following their arrival in Germany before being assigned to their

permanent host family and school.

SOPHOMORES & JUNIORS: SUMMER VENTURES IN SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS [SVSM] provides an opportunity for rising 11th & 12th graders to foster identified interests in science and mathematics with its enriched program in a university research setting [ASU, ECU, UNC-Charlotte, UNC-Wilmington]. SVSM is competitive entry by application only. Selected students participate in a rigorous, four-week summer academic program intended to reward and stimulate students who have already demonstrated their commitment to academic growth and development in science and mathematics. SVSM is a state-supported initiative and there is no program costs for participants. Applications are to be completed online and can be accessed from the website at <u>www.summerventures.org</u>. As part of the application process, applicants must secure evaluations from a science or math teacher and his or her current guidance counselor. It is the responsibility of the applicants to ask their teacher and counselor to complete an evaluation on their behalf. The completion deadline for student portion of the application is January 15, 2019.

The N.C. Teaching Fellows program has been re-established to attract talented students to teach STEM and special education in North Carolina's public schools and NC State University was selected as one of the program sites. Seniors who are considering a major in education can receive \$33,000 in forgivable loans [\$8,250 per year for up to four years] if they are willing to commit to teach in STEM or special education in North Carolina public school. NCSU offers the following majors that qualify for the N. Cl Teaching Fellows Program: Agricultural Education (Grades 6-12)

- Elementary Education with Special Education Dual Licensure (Grades K-12)**
- Mathematics Education (Grades 6-9 or 9-12)
- Science Education (Grades 6-9 or 9-12)
- Technology, Engineering, & Design Education (Grades 6-12)
