GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - India: Solar power is increasing women's productivity and earnings in the garment trade. The government of Uttar Pradesh, India's most populous state, has distributed 4,000 solar-powered spinning wheels since 2018, replacing hand- or foot- powered charkhas. The machines feature 12 spindles, a motor, and battery pack, and they connect to a 400-watt solar panel.

This summer, choose your adventure abroad -- Language/Science/Leadership/Arts/Business/International Relations. Picture yourself in one of 30 amazing destinations in Europe, Asia, Latin America or Africa. The [CIEE Global Navigator High School Study Abroad immersive programs](#) are three to four weeks long and combine experiential classes led by local experts with excursions you won't want to miss. CIEE (the Council on International Education Exchange) has \$5.4 million in study abroad scholarship funds to award to U.S. high school students in summer 2023! Since Broughton is a magnet school for Global Studies with an IB program, I believe CIEE's mission around global education is very much in alignment with the school's offerings,

The Summer Training in Academic Research (STAR) Program, hosted by Duke University, provides a high-quality research experience for undergraduate students, high school students, and middle and high school teachers during the summer academic break. The eight-week program will give participants who are interested in science and medicine real hands-on experience in research methodology and writing. Participants are placed in teams and matched with Duke faculty mentors to work on an original, hypothesis-driven project, originating as a one-page summary and culminating in a complete research paper. A goal of the program is to have every participant qualify for co-authorship on a peer-reviewed manuscript related to their team's project. The STAR Program is held at the Duke Clinical Research Institute in Durham, N.C., which has organized educational and support programs for junior faculty, fellows, residents, and medical students as well as high school and college students. *Participants receive a stipend to attend, which makes the program an option even for students who planned to work over the summer break ([see below](#)).* The Duke STAR Program 2023 application period is November 21, 2022 to January 6, 2023. *There will be no extension.* The

program will take place June 20 to August 10, 2023. *Questions may be submitted via email (dukestarprogram@duke.edu). We regret that we are unable to respond to phone calls.*
