Calling all current 11th Graders!

If you are interested in pursuing an internship for your senior year, please plan to attend a **REQUIRED [Internship Interest Meeting](#)** during the month of January in Advisory class.

- Did you know you can leave campus and go to work during the school day for HONORS course credit?
- CTE Internship is a year long course that allows 12th grade students to take an active working role in a local business or organization for HONORS credit.
- An internship looks great on a college application and on a resume!
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While an internship is only available for 12th graders, students must apply for acceptance into the Broughton Internship Program during their 11th grade year. (Students who do not attend an interest meeting during January will **NOT** be eligible to register for an internship during their senior year. No exceptions.)

SOPHOMORES & JUNIORS: SUMMER VENTURES IN SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS [SVSM] provides an opportunity for rising 11th & 12th graders to foster identified interests in science and mathematics with its enriched program in a university research setting [ASU, ECU, UNC-Charlotte, UNC-Wilmington]. SVSM is competitive entry by application only. Selected students participate in a rigorous, four-week summer academic program intended to reward and stimulate students who have already demonstrated their commitment to academic growth and development in science and mathematics. SVSM is a state-supported initiative and there is no program costs for participants. Applications are to be completed online and can be accessed from the website at www.summerventures.org. As part of the application process, applicants must secure evaluations from a science or math teacher and his or her current guidance counselor. It is the responsibility of the applicants to ask their teacher and counselor to complete an evaluation on their behalf. The completion deadline for student portion of the application is January 15, 2019.

The N.C. Teaching Fellows program has been re-established to attract talented students to teach STEM and special education in North Carolina's public schools and NC State University was selected as one of the program sites. Seniors who are considering a major in education can receive \$33,000 in forgivable loans [\$8,250 per year for up to four years] if they are willing to commit to teach in STEM or special education in North Carolina public school. NCSU offers the following majors that qualify for the N. CI Teaching Fellows Program:

Agricultural Education (Grades 6-12)

- Elementary Education with Special Education Dual Licensure (Grades K-12)**
- Mathematics Education (Grades 6-9 or 9-12)
- Science Education (Grades 6-9 or 9-12)
- Technology, Engineering, & Design Education (Grades 6-12)
