GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Finland: Finnish communities are working together to restore ecosystems devastated by climate change and human development. In the late 1960s, seeing how warming winters threatened biodiversity and indigenous culture in Finland, a group of fishers, scientists, and activists started traveling to remote Arctic villages to document indigenous traditions and environmental knowledge. They eventually established Snowchange, a network of communities throughout Finland to expand their efforts.
