PARENT ANNOUNCEMENTS

The following information was sent to all families on January 4, 2021 by phone, email, and text message. In the mailing, each family received notification of the student's assigned cohort or confirmation of Virtual Academy enrollment for second semester.

Please ensure you have reviewed the information below that was included in the mailing in preparation for our students' return to the school building on January 20th.

- Cohort Calendar: Please review [this WCPSS cohort calendar](#) to ensure you know when your child(ren) reports to the school building. Your child(ren) only comes to school on the days showing your child(ren)'s cohort number. On the days where your child(ren) stays home, she/he/they will engage in virtual learning. Students in the Virtual Academy will learn remotely for the remainder of the school year.
- Bell Schedule: Beginning January 20th, all of our students will be learning on a different bell schedule given that teachers will be teaching students in-person and online at the same time. Please review [this bell schedule](#) that will begin on January 20, in which 1st period will begin at 7:25 per our WCPSS approved bell schedule. If you have not already reviewed the instructional plan, please do so [here](#).
- Bus Attestation: Any student who will use WCPSS Transportation must complete the online bus attestation form [here](#).
- Student Procedures: We ask that your child(ren) and all parents review [these student procedures](#) in full. We will go over these procedures with students during advisory their first week back at school. The following are the three most important procedural items:
 - 3 Ws: All students are required to follow the 3 Ws at all time anywhere on school property, including outdoors. Students are required to: wear a mask; wait six feet apart from others; and wash their hands/use hand sanitizer frequently.
 - Morning Health Screening: All students will undergo a daily morning health screening, so students must report to only one of two places when they arrive to the building: the front east (right) portico at the front of the building or the front of the Holliday gym near the bus loop. Health screenings will begin at 6:55am, and students should arrive to campus by no later than 7am to get their health screening completed and be in class on time at 7:25am.
 - Technology: All students will be utilizing technology while at school. Students are required to bring their WCPSS issued chromebook or (if preferred) their personal device and a set of headphones to school each day.

- Live, Virtual Parent Sessions: To support our students' transition back to in-person learning or as they continue with Virtual Academy, we are offering two live, virtual parent sessions next week on Wednesday, January 13th at 5pm and Thursday, January 14th at noon. GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Botswana: An amendment to the 2015 Land Policy in Botswana expands women's rights to own land. Before now, land rights were only granted to unmarried women or wives of men who were not already landowners. While the government can issue deeds to anyone with a legitimate claim to land, that process could take decades, leaving millions of women - widows, single mothers, and many wives - vulnerable. The new policy grants equal eligibility to a residential plot anywhere women choose.

The program is a unique opportunity for students to gain a first-hand view of many fascinating career paths available in the agricultural sciences field, including plant and animal health and sciences, wildlife management, biotechnology, environmental science, forestry, entomology, food safety and food production, as well as managing the business aspects of agriculture. **AgDiscovery** challenges students to consider the importance of American agriculture, and the role USDA plays in this critical mission. The program educates students about career opportunities within USDA, by stimulating and promoting advanced interest in, and knowledge of agriculturally-related fields of study. The program exposes students to the interconnections of agriculture in both rural and urban communities, and the diversity of career opportunities offered in the field of agricultural sciences. Students encounter USDA staff in action, while visiting a variety of USDA facilities, research centers, and farming environments. USDA employees conduct a variety of workshops, classes, and hands-on activities for the students, allowing them to practice innovative and advanced agricultural technologies, and to interact and network with agricultural professionals. AgDiscovery students also take part in several career development activities organized by APHIS and learn about the training required for various career paths, affording them a realistic view of

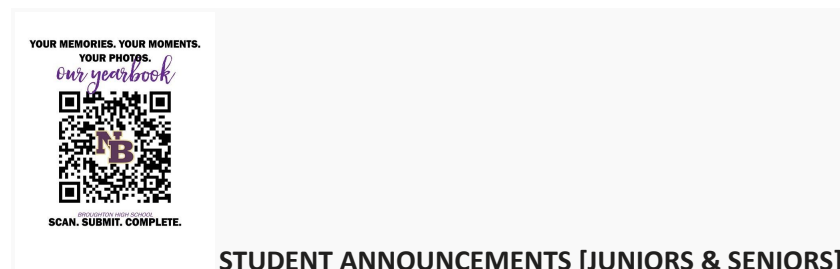

Juniors and Seniors who have no outstanding fines may apply for an off-campus lunch pass for the Spring 2021 semester. A parent/guardian must sign the off-campus lunch form found in the School News section of the BHS website and students should bring the form to school and pick up a temporary lunch pass according to the schedule listed on the form.

The PSAT will be offered to registered Juniors on Tuesday, January 26 during periods 1A-3A. This year, WCPSS has decided to allow ONLY 11th graders to participate in this exam. There is a fee of \$17 to take the assessment, but 11th grade students with a GPA at or above 4.3438 can take the test for free. Students who believe they have a GPA at or above 4.3438 and want to take the test should register with this form: tinyurl.com/freepsat2020. All other students should register online. The online registration window for testing will open on 12/1 and will close 12/18. Online registration link: tinyurl.com/BROUGHTONPSAT2020. Students who are unable to participate in the Jan 26 administration (9th, 10th, and 12th graders) can take official PSAT practice tests on their own and get the diagnostic information that can be used to improve future performance.
