GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Congo: Communities in Congo are obtaining legal ownership over the forest areas where they reside, and evidence suggests these concessions can help combat climate change. The Congo BAsin, the world's second-largest rainforest, sinks 1.2 billion metric tons of carbon dioxide annually and houses an estimated 10,000 unique species. However, the critical ecosystem faces accelerating deforestation, largely driven by small-scale agriculture. Since the first concession was granted in 2017, around 7,700 square miles of forest have been allocated, or are in the process of being allocated, to local communities.

ACT On-Campus for Juniors

The ACT is scheduled on-campus for all 11th graders on Tuesday, February 23. All 11th Grade students must go to my.act.org to create their MyACT account prior to test day. Once the account is created, students will need to login to complete their profile and demographic information. Students do NOT need to register for the February 23 test. Students are already registered for the test, but they still need to create their own MyACT account so that they can receive their scores electronically. Once students create their login and they sign into the MyACT site, they should click their name at the top right corner of the screen and complete the "About Me" section to complete their test profile.
