GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Vatican City: A new decree from Pope Francis allows women to be altar servers, distributors of Communion, and readers at liturgies - roles many women were already carrying out around the world but are now protected by the Code of Canon Law. Previously, a conservative bishop could bar women from serving in these roles. "This codifies that women are equal to men in these roles and is big because in some cultures women are still considered unclean and cannot be near the sacred," said Phyllis Zangano, a religion professor at Hofstra University in New York.

ACT On-Campus for Juniors

The ACT is scheduled on-campus for all 11th graders on Tuesday, February 23. All 11th Grade students must go to <u>my.act.org</u> to create their MyACT account prior to test day. Once the account is created, students will need to login to complete their profile and demographic information. Students do NOT need to register for the February 23 test. Students are already registered for the test, but they still need to create their own MyACT account so that they can receive their scores electronically. Once students create their login and they sign into the MyACT site, they should click their name at the top right corner of the screen and complete the "About Me" section to complete their test profile. More details about test day and directions for students will be shared closer to test day.
