GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Mexico: Mexico City's ban on most single-use plastics came into effect in January after more than a year of preparation. In 2020, Mexico City's environmental agency said the capital produced roughly 13,000 tons of garbage per day, including more than 7 million tons of plastic over the course of the year. Single-use plastic bags were banned in 2020, and now the commercialization, distribution, and delivery of other plastic products, including straws, disposable plastic cups, and balloons, is prohibited.

Any student who has failed S1 courses: Students will have the opportunity to earn a 60% on their Semester 1 grade if and only if they pass both 3rd Quarter and 4th Quarter within their current classes.

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The SAT will be administered at Broughton March 13th. Students registered to take the test should report by 7:45 am with an Admission Ticket, acceptable photo id, two No. 2 pencils and a soft eraser [No PENS or MECHANICAL PENCILS], acceptable calculator, and a snack. Your photo ID must be a physical valid [unexpired], original, government- or school- issued, and bear your full legal name. The name on your ID must exactly match the name on your Admission Ticket. Health screenings will be conducted outside prior to entry so plan for inclement weather if needed.

Juniors. Broughton has been asked to nominate current juniors as Wofford Scholars. Qualified candidates are eligible to compete for scholarships ranging from \$15,000 per year up to a full scholarship. The deadline for nominations is June 15, 2021.* Any nominations submitted after June 15 will be considered on a case-by-case basis. The criteria for nomination are as follows:

- Students must rank in the top 10% of the class. (If your school does not rank, you may be asked to send transcripts)
- Students must have achieved a minimum score of 1300 (critical reading and math combined) on the SAT or 28 composite
 on the ACT.
- Students must, in your opinion, demonstrate qualities of scholarship, leadership, and potential for success. Students should also have an interest in attending Wofford College.
- All students who are nominated for this program must apply by either our Early Decision or Early Action deadline.

Nominees are screened by the Wofford Scholars Selection Committee. Students who meet the criteria, will be invited to participate in Wofford Scholars Day in November. This program includes interviews for the students and various information sessions for nominees and their parents.
