GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - United States: The U.S. Senate confirmed the first openly gay Cabinet secretary. The SAT will be administered at Broughton March 13th. Your photo ID must be a physical valid [unexpired], original, government- or school- issued, and bear your full legal name. The name on your ID must exactly match the name on your Admission Ticket. Health screenings will be conducted outside prior to entry so plan for inclement weather if needed.
