March 1 - March 15 - Online Registration Window Open (Rising 10th-12th grade students can enter courses in PowerSchool). The SAT will be administered at Broughton March 13th. Students registered to take the test should report by 7:45 am with an Admission Ticket, acceptable photo id, two No. 2 pencils and a soft eraser [No PENS or MECHANICAL PENCILS], acceptable calculator, and a snack. Your photo ID must be a physical valid [unexpired], original, government- or school- issued, and bear your full legal name. The name on your ID must exactly match the name on your Admission Ticket. Health screenings will be conducted outside prior to entry so plan for inclement weather if needed.
