Current 9th-12th graders may want to check out a Summer Internship on Engineering Biology @ NC State University. The program and its sponsor strongly encourages application from groups that are underrepresented in the STEM and Bioengineering Disciplines as defined by the NSF [African-Americans, LatinX, Native Americans, Alaskan Natives, Native Hawaiians, and other Pacific Islanders; Women and girls; Veterans enrolled in post-secondary education; and Persons with disabilities]. Stipends provided [\$2800 for high school students. The internship is tentatively scheduled June 20-July 31. Selection and interviews will necessarily occur well in advance of knowing whether the internship can be done in person @ NCSU.
