**GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Latvia:** Latvia passed a restitution bill to compensate Jewish communities for property losses incurred during World War II. Around 90% of the nation's Jewish population was killed during the Holocaust, and hundreds of buildings were expropriated by the state in the Soviet era. The bill pledges \$45 million to reimburse Holocaust survivors for lost property as well as refurbish community buildings and support cultural projects.

It is awarded to a Wake County public high school graduate who has been accepted at a four-year college/university or a two-year community college. - Graduate from a North Carolina High school or earn a GED/HISET in 2022. Students who completed high school requirements in December 2021 or anytime in 2022 qualify.
- Be admitted to a Wake Tech credit program
- Be a first-time college student. Career and College Promise and Early/Middle College students qualify.
- Complete the 2022-23 FAFSA
- Be a resident of North Carolina as determined by the Residency Determination Service (RDS)
- Enroll in at least 6 credit hours per semester
