March 1 - March 15 - Online Registration Window Open (*Rising 10th-12th grade students can enter courses in PowerSchool*). Course registration for 2021-2022 will open for students on March 1st and remain open until March 15th. GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - South Africa: South Africa saw a 33% drop in rhino poaching in 2020 compared with the previous year, marking the sixth year that poaching has declined. Last year, 394 rhinos were reportedly killed for their horn in South Africa, down from 594 in 2019. A total of 156 people were arrested for rhino poaching or horn trafficking across the country, and authorities engaged in more than 25 major investigations. The continued improvement comes after the government implemented new wildlife protection strategies, including public awareness campaigns and regional information sharing.

The SAT will be administered at Broughton March 13th. Students registered to take the test should report by 7:45 am with an Admission Ticket, acceptable photo id, two No. 2 pencils and a soft eraser [No PENS or MECHANICAL PENCILS], acceptable calculator, and a snack. Your photo ID must be a physical valid [unexpired], original, government- or school- issued, and bear your full legal name. The name on your ID must exactly match the name on your Admission Ticket. Health screenings will be conducted outside prior to entry so plan for inclement weather if needed.

SUMMER OPPORTUNITIES

Current 9th-12th graders may want to check out a Summer Internship on Engineering Biology @ NC State University. The program and its sponsor strongly encourages application from groups that are underrepresented in the STEM and Bioengineering Disciplines as defined by the NSF [African-Americans, LatinX, Native Americans, Alaskan Natives, Native Hawaiians, and other Pacific Islanders; Women and girls; Veterans enrolled in post-secondary education; and Persons with disabilities]. Stipends provided [\$2800 for high school students. The internship is tentatively scheduled June 20-July 31. Selection and interviews will necessarily occur well in advance of knowing whether the internship can be done in person @ NCSU.
