Students who are selected to participate in Future Teachers receive annual professional development (including stipends), and teaching jobs with WCPSS, in their areas of licensure, upon the completion of their college educator preparation programs. The CRP module was established primarily to assist students who have been denied admission from the institution of their choice and are seeking opportunities to pursue higher education in the fall. The goal is for every student in the College Redirection Pool to be contacted by at least one of their local schools.
