GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - United States: The suicide rate in the United States reached a five-year low in 2020, defying predictions that self-harm would rise during lockdowns. Instead, a preliminary report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention shows deaths by suicide fell to 44,834 last year, a 5.6% decrease from 2019 figures. This is the second consecutive annual decline, and marks the lowest suicide rate since 2015.
