GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Israel: Israel welcomed its first deaf Knesset member. Shirley Pinto, a longtime advocate for people with hearing loss, was sworn into the Israeli parliament in sign language and spoken Hebrew. The Yamina lawmaker replaces new Religious Affairs Minister Matan Kahana under the Norwegian Law, which allows newly appointed Cabinet members to temporarily step down so another candidate from their party can take their place in the Knesset.

Juniors & Seniors who are eligible for OFF-CAMPUS lunch passes: Lunch passes will be available again before school and after school beginning Wednesday.

In 1990, after working in admissions at Virginia State and at Clark Atlanta University, Mason founded the Common Black College Application. His portal allows students to apply to all of the network's 61 member HBCUs, and specify their top four choices, for one \$20 fee. The app has a few twists from the better-known Common Application, which students can use to apply to up to 20 of the more than 900 participating colleges. That portal is free to use, but students must pay application fees to colleges that require them.For \$20 students can apply to all 61 member HBCUs, and specify their top four choices.

Colgate's test-optional pilot program makes submission of SAT and ACT scores optional for all applicants through 2023. Application Deadlines: Early Decision II - November 15. Early Decision II and Regular Decision:

January 15. Fall Campus Visits [Visit experiences] are offered in the morning and afternoon most days of the week. They

include an information session led by an admission officer followed by a student-led campus tour. Students can register for a visit on a day and time that works for them.
